To all to whom these presents shall come, greeting;

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1805, entitled "An act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land, to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," there has been <sup>deposited</sup> ~~deposited~~ in the General Land Office, Narrant No. 41,660 for 80 acres, in favor of Thomas J. Whatley, Private, <sup>captain</sup> ~~Private~~ Brian Champ's company, Alabama Militia, Creek War with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the West half of the South West quarter of Section ten, in Township six South of Range three East, in the District of Lands subject to sale at M. Stephens, Alabama, containing Eighty acres and forty three hundredths of an acre, according to the official plat of the survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, the said narrant having been assigned by the said Thomas J. Whatley to Apphia B. Lea in whose favor said tract has been located.

Now know ye, That there is therefore granted by the The United States unto the said Apphia B. Lea as assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs the tract of Land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Apphia B. Lea, as assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, James Buchanan President of the United States of America, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
