To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855, entitled "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, Warrant No. 32,889 for 160 acres, in favor of George Welsh, Private, Captain Welsh Company, Alabama U.S. Volunteers, War 1812

with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the South West quarter of section three in Township six South, of Range three East, in the District of Lands subject to sale at St Stephens, Alabama, containing One hundred and sixty acres and forty six hundredths of an acre

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL the said Warrant having been assigned by the said George Welsh to William S. Lea in whose favor said tract has been located

NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said William S. Lea as assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said William S. Lea as assignee as aforesaid and to his

heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, James Buchanan PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
