The United States of America.

To all to whom these Presents shall come Greeting  
 Whereas, I, in pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved  
 March 3, 1855, entitled "An Act in addition to certain acts granting  
 bounty land to certain officers and soldiers who have been  
 engaged in the Military Service of the United States," there has  
 been deposited in the general land office Warrant No. 41,985 for  
 120 acres, in favor of Samuel A. Wilkins, Lieutenant, Captain  
 Richards and Stokes Companies, 12th Regiment United States Infantry,  
 War with Mexico, with evidence that the same has been duly located  
 upon the east half of the Southeast quarter and the South West  
 quarter of the South East quarter of section ten, in township six  
 South, of range three East, in the District of land formerly subject  
 to sale at St Stephens, near Mobile, Alabama, containing one hundred  
 and twenty acres and sixty-four and one half hundredths of an  
 acre, according to the official plat of the survey of the said land  
 returned to the general Land office by the Surveyor General the said  
 warrant having been assigned by the said Samuel A. Wilkins to  
 Apphia B. Lee, in whose favor said tract has been located;

Now Know Ye. That There is therefore granted  
 by the United States unto the said Apphia B. Lee, as assignee  
 as aforesaid, and to his heirs the tract of land above described;

To have and to hold the said tract of land  
 with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Apphia B. Lee,  
 as assignee as aforesaid, and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Andrew Johnson President  
 of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be  
 made Patent, and the seal of the general Land Office to be hereunto  
 affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington  
 the third day of October, in the year of our  
 Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty eight  
 and of the independence of the United States the  
 Ninety Third.
