according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for and the acts supplemental thereto, for the South East quarter of Section three and the North East quarter of Section ten in Township six South of Range three East of St Stephens Meridian in Alabama, containing three hundred and twenty-one acres and thirty-two hundredths of an acre.

according to the official plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been purchased by the said William J. Lea.

and to his heirs and assigns forever.
