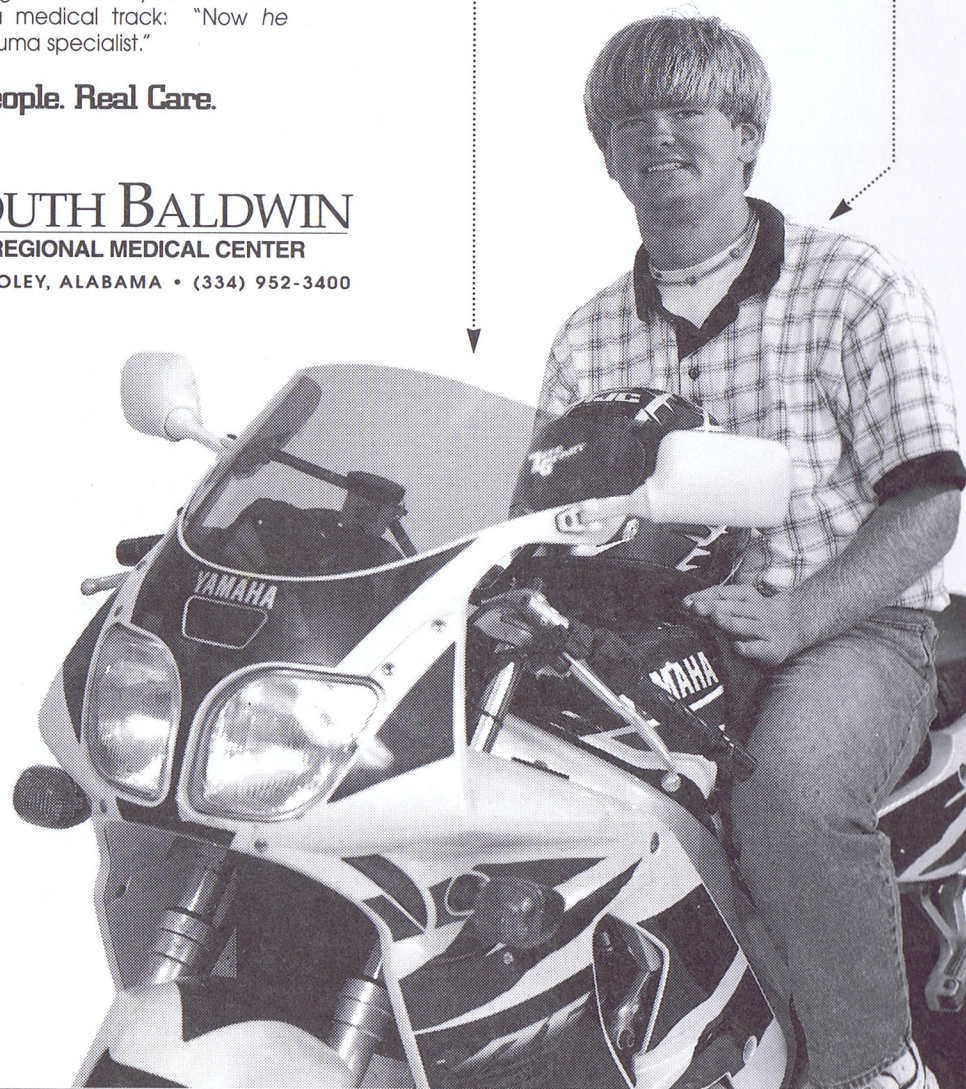
"Richie impaled himself on a metal fence," says Diana Rockwell, whose family owns *The Track Recreation Center* in Gulf Shores.
