This year the umpires want a flat \$7.50 for the plate and \$5.00 for the bases with an additional \$1.50 for traveling expenses, making a total of \$14.00 instead of \$12.50. As late as 4:00 p.m., Saturday, the umpires did not know whether to report or not but it turned out O.K.

There is a league ruling stating that these umpires must be used or the games can be declared "no contests" . . . the league can change this by a vote of the majority. Since this umpire assoc. is Congress there can be no other branch of this Congress within 50 miles.

The play-offs are a best-of-seven games affair.

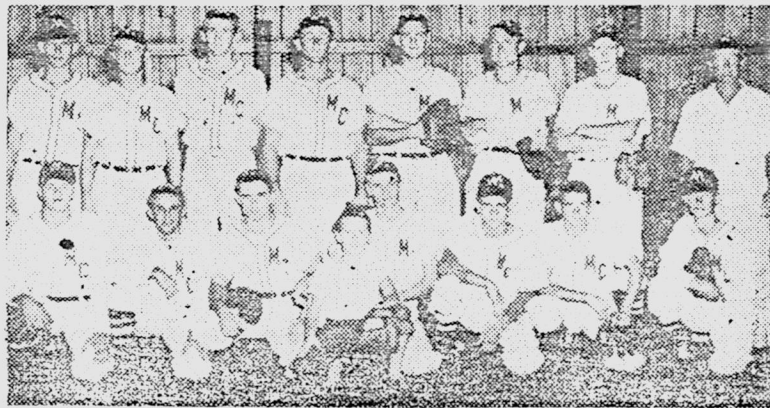

Play-Offs

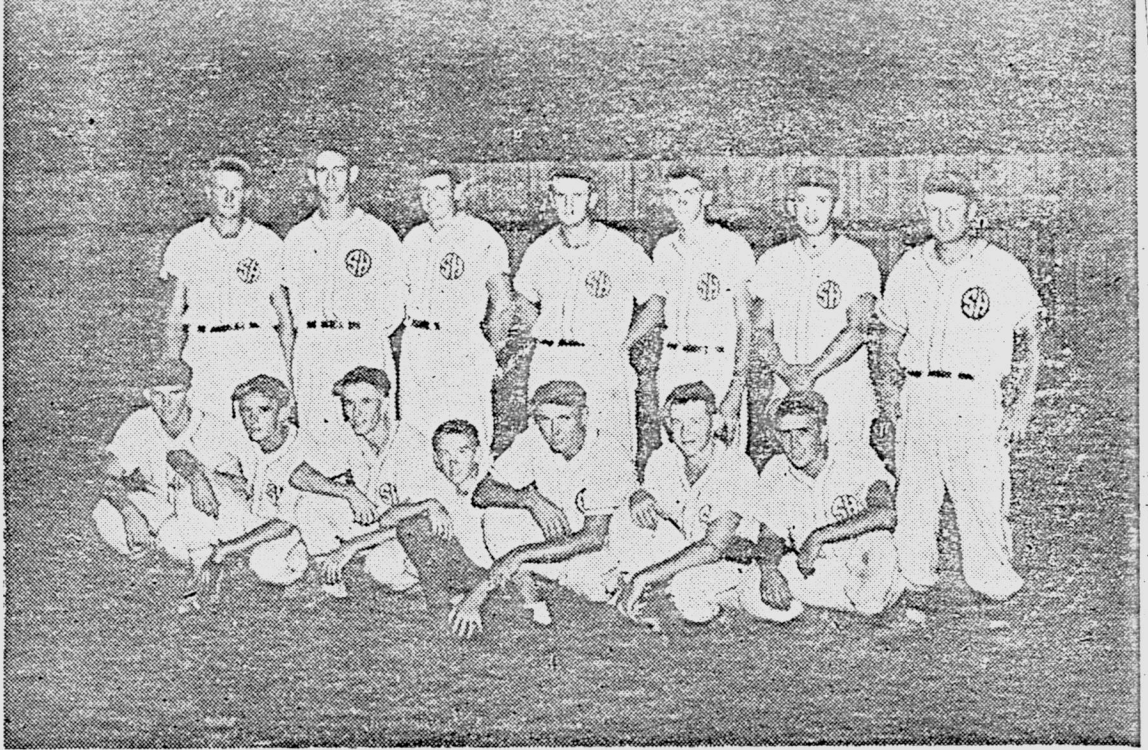
In all these play-offs we have

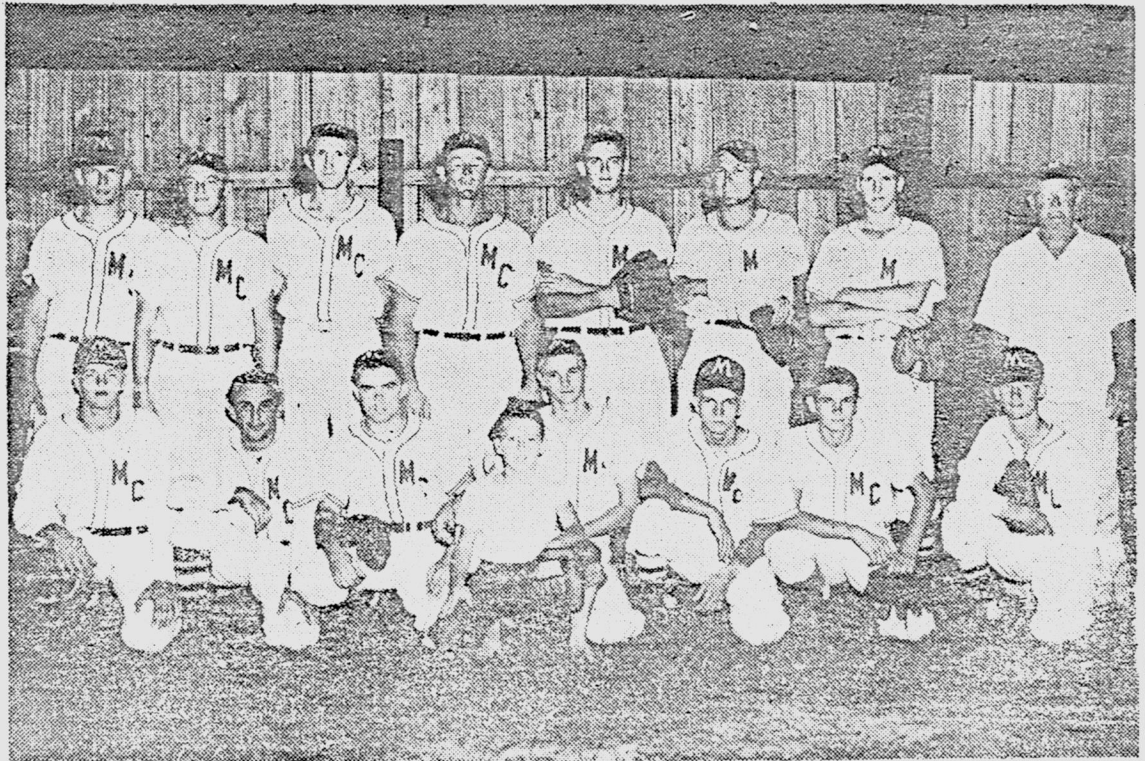

The Baldwin citizens are making an appeal for \$2500 which is needed for the heart operation and the care of Junior while he is at Oschner's Clinic in New Orleans.

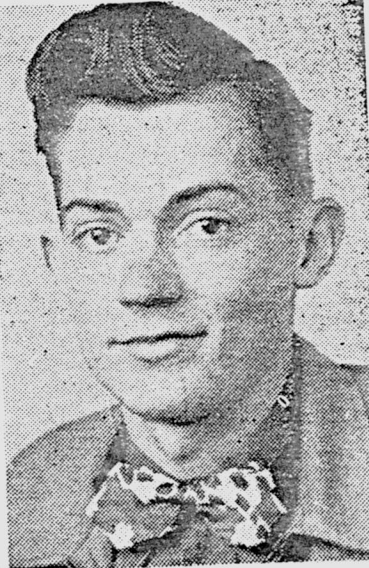
A few weeks ago, Junior's mother, Mrs. Eloise Chandler, was informed after a thorough examination at Oschner's Clinic that he can be cured with the necessary operation.

Junior was born a "blue baby" or cyanotic. That is his venous and arterial blood gets mixed, which is caused by the lack of complete closure in one of the partitions in the heart.

The operation is set at Oschner's Clinic for October 9. He will remain in the clinic for about one month.
